What is a Registered LNR Child Care Provider?

For some people, operating a small daycare is ideal. For others, it can be a stepping stone to becoming a Licensed Family Child Care Provider.

Registered LNRs can care for 2 children or one sibling group at any time. This is in addition to the Child Care Provider's own children, children related to them by blood or relationship, or foster children in their care.

Becoming registered lets parents know that their child is in a safe environment. The Child Care Provider will have first aid certification, references, no criminal record, and has completed a Health and Safety Home Assessment. They also have some family child care training and ongoing professional development.

What are the benefits of becoming a Registered LNR?

hat do you need to become a Registered License-Not-Required child care provider?

- Be at least 19 years of age (proof of ID required)
- Be a resident of the appropriate CCRR boundary (Surrey, Delta, White Rock)
- Provide child care for a maximum of 2 children or one sibling group at any one time, (not
 including child care provider's own children related by blood or marriage)
- Complete the Child Care Provider Self-Evaluation attached to this package
- Have one on one consultation with a CCRR outreach consultant
- Complete and have clearance of criminal record checks for everyone in the home over 12 years of age (to be done every 5 years)
- Provide a doctor's note or letter stating the applicant is fit to look after children
- Provide at least 2 character references (with one not family related)
- Produce a current valid First Aid Certificate or proof of registration (as approved by the CCRR)
- Successfully complete an initial Health & Safety Home Assessment Visit by an outreach consultant
- Complete a minimum of 20 hours of family child care training (approved by the CCRR)
 *Child Care Provider must complete this training prior to or within one year of registering as a Registered License-Not-Required child care provider
- Agree to a minimum of one support visit per year and one Health & Safety Home Assessment
 Visit
- Attend at least two professional development workshops per registration year



Child Care Provider Self-Evaluation LNR Registration Process

The Self-Evaluation form, given out early in the registration process, is an opportunity for you to personally reflect on some of the issues related to the provision of quality child care in your home and is intended for your files only. It does not need to be returned to the CCRR.

Answering the questions can guide your decisions about whether or not a career in child care is appropriate for you. If you would like to discuss anything on this form with the CCRR consultant, it can be a great opportunity for the CCRR to support you. We hope this form assists you.
