

Registration Policies and Procedures

- ♦ To reserve a space, payment must be received at the time of registration for the workshop. Registrations will not be processed until payment has been received. Post-dated cheques will not be accepted.
- Methods of payment: Cheque, Visa and MasterCard are accepted. Payment by debit or cash is available for inperson registration.
- Registrations are accepted by telephone, by fax or by mail with payment.

- Workshop cancellations. Requests for workshop cancellations MUST be received at least 48 hours prior to the scheduled workshop date. Cancellation requests received before the 48 hour deadline will receive a credit voucher to be used towards future workshops at Child Care Options. No refunds will be issued.
- ♦ Course cancellations. Requests for course cancellations MUST be received at least 72 hours prior to the scheduled course start date. Cancellation requests received before the 72 hour deadline will receive a cheque for the amount of the course minus a \$25.00 administration fee. Cancellation requests received less than 72 hours prior to the scheduled course start date will be issued a credit voucher for the amount of the course minus a \$25.00 administration fee. The credit voucher can be used towards future courses and workshops at Child care Options.

Safe Spaces: Bullying Prevention for Preschool-Aged Children

2 Saturdays, April 2 & 16 + 1 hour pre-reading • 9:00 am - 3:30 pm • Cost: \$150.00 (workbook included) • Surrey • *Registration deadline is March 14, 2016.*

The Safe Spaces program developed by Westcoast Child Care Resource Centre has been updated! Safe Spaces is an evidence based, developmentally appropriate, holistic and integrated approach to teaching young children 3-5 years of age, pro-social and emotional vocabulary as well as skills identified as essential in preventing bullying behaviours. It teaches young children the skills they need to resist and prevent bullying while nurturing their self-esteem and caring about others, establishing a bully free environment. Requirements:

- -Participants must have Early Childhood Education training to register
- -Participants must read the pre-reading material that will be emailed prior to the first day of training.

20 Hour Responsible Adult in Child Care Settings Course

This course meets the requirements for 20 hours of training for "Responsible Adult" as stipulated by the Child Care Regulation to qualify for employment in family child care or school age child care settings.

Through interactive sessions, this course covers basic concepts about child development, child guidance, health, safety, nutrition and programming. Participants must be at least 19 years old to register, attend all sessions and pass all open book quizzes with a satisfactory mark in order to receive a certificate of completion.

For those planning on opening a family child care we offer the Good Beginnings Professional Development for Family Child Care Providers course (30 hours). This course will

explore all areas of operating a family child care business in your home. It will also guide you to create the policies and procedures necessary for the child care licensing process. You will meet others exploring family child care and be provided with resources and contacts specific to your family child care business.

Rest-Play-Grow: Making Sense of Young Children

No one is more likely to be misunderstood than the young child (aged 2 to 6). They are precocious, brazen, obsessive, endearing, hysterical, impulsive, anxious,

delightful, unreflective, generous, unstable, aggressive, resistant, compulsive, and inconsistent but this is how they were meant to be. Based on developmental science, this presentation is for parents and professionals who want more than just strategies for handling problem behaviour and are interested in helping young kids thrive and flourish. It will provide answers to commonly misunderstood preschooler behaviour including resistance, frustrtion, aggression, attention issues, anxiety, attachment, the need for play, discipline, and impulsiveness. 

Mini Musicians: Musical Experiences for Young Children

Music is the integration of movement and language, dancing, singing, listening, playing percussion instruments, creating, improvising and playing musical games in a social setting. As children become actively involved in creating music, they absorb musical elements such as rhythm, beat, tempo, dynamics and timbre, which lead to musical literacy. All facets of expressing, creating and performing music are integrated into each musical activity.

Feeling safe and comfortable in a musical setting can enhance a child's self -esteem. Through participating and exploring music in an appropriate sequence of experiences, children will



develop a lifelong joy and appreciation of music.

Parent Education Evening: Help My Child is Not Rational - Figuring Out Your Preschooler Monday, June 6 • 6:30 - 8:30 pm • Cost: \$20.00 (no certificate) • Surrey






