

Registration Policies and Procedures

- ♦ To reserve a space, payment must be received at the time of registration for the workshop. Registrations will not be processed until payment has been received. Post-dated cheques will not be accepted.



Observation and Reflection: Practices for Supporting Immigrant and Refugee Children and Families

A continual concern for educators and child-care professionals is an understanding of behaviour and providing relevant resources to shift behaviour towards desired social norms.
