Replacement certificates will be issued for **up to 5 years** of the date of the workshop. Fees may apply.



EMPOWERING CHILDREN: NURTURING CONSENT, RESPECT, AND AUTONOMY

HARMONIOUS CLASSROOMS: FOSTERING CONNECTION, COLLABORATION AND PEACE


BEHAVIOUR THROUGH A DIFFERENT LENS
